Atkinson, John Surtees (H 1930 – 1934)

Captain, 3rd Cavalry, Indian Armoured Corps. Killed in action during the retreat from Batu Tiga to Singapore. Remembered on the Singapore Memorial. 26/1/1942 aged 26 years.

Captain, Royal Engineers. Died on active service in India. Buried at Gauhati War Cemetery, 3.E.9. 16/6/1942 aged 41 years.

Bradley, Kenneth Richard (P 1931 – 1935)

Captain, 2nd Battalion East Surrey Regiment.

Killed in action near the Muda River during the retreat from Gurun, North Malaya.

Remembered on the Singapore Memorial.

Captain, Assam Regiment. Died of wounds sustained at Jail Hill during the battle for Kohima, which began on 4th April. Buried at Kohima War Cemetery, Assam, 4. H. 10. 6/4/1944 aged 32 years.

Bryham, Peter William (E 1935 – 1940)

Lieutenant, 18th Royal Garhwal Rifles.

Killed in action in Singapore on the day of its surrender.

Remembered on the Singapore Memorial.

However, later evidence suggests that his boat was wrecked on a small island where he and his companions were discovered by the Japanese and killed. Remembered on the Singapore Memorial. 13/2/1942 aged 46 years.

Isherwood, George Herbert (SH 1925 – 1928)

Lieutenant, 1st Manchester Regiment.

Died as a PoW.

Buried Thanbyuzayat War Cemetery, Burma.

Captain, 1/8th Punjabis. Killed in action near Jitra, Malaya. Remembered on the Singapore Memorial. 10/12/1941 aged 25 years.

Lockhart, James (S 1930 – 1935)

Flight Lieutenant, RAFVR, 258 Squadron India Command. Killed in action off Colombo. Buried Colombo (Kanatte) General Cemetery, Sri Lanka. 15/4/1942 aged 26 years.

Major, Burma Frontier Force. Killed near Mangkheng ten miles south west of Falam. Remembered on the Rangoon Memorial. 9/11/1943 aged 27 years.

Major, 2nd Battalion Durham Light Infantry. Killed by a sniper in action at Garrison Hill during the battle for Kohima, on the same day as WW Lockhart. Remembered on the Rangoon Memorial, Face 17. 23/4/1944 aged 25 years.

Sykes, Reginald Swinnerton (SH 1927 – 1931)

Major, Royal Army Service Corps. Died as a PoW in Nong Pladuk Camp, Siam, as a result of allied bombing. Buried Chungkai War Cemetery, Thailand. 3/12/1944 aged 31 years.
