He was captain of Sedbergh Cricket Team. And took pride in the main square of Sedbergh school cricket pitch. He worked every Saturday all year, either with the rugby team in the winter or the cricket in the spring/summer. I know some boys will remember him as the man to avoid as he used to flush out students who were smoking on/at cloisters in the break times etc. he would send them to the school office occasionally too! He went on to work as ground staff at L&M college till his retirement in 2021. Still involved heavily with the sports teams. He passed away at home on Saturday 12th March at the age of 66 due to the sudden discovery of advanced inoperable cancer.
